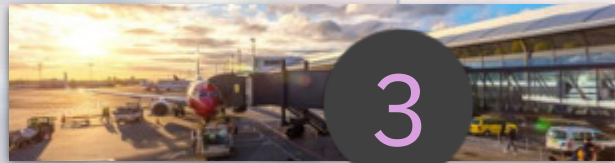
# How to reach Italy



First and easiest option is **TORINO CASELLE airport**.  
It is not connected to all airports, but it is the closest to Turin.



Second and most popular option is **MILANO MALPENSA airport**.  
This airport is connected with most of European capitals.



Options for cheap solutions: Bergamo Orio al Serio, Linate.  
These two airports could offer some cheap flights, but are a bit more far away from Turin.

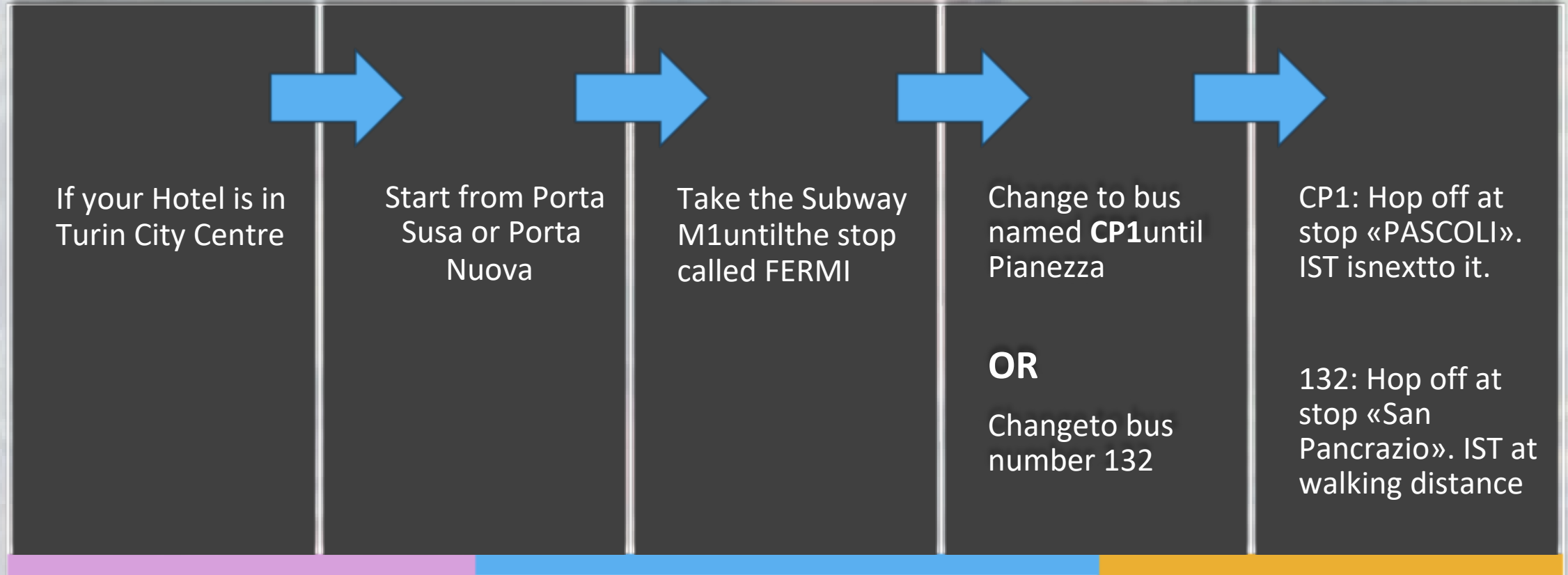

# How to reach us in Pianezza at the Institute



## **NOTE:**

In Turin you can use the tramway n.4 to move through the whole city center. For further info on busses check google maps.

## **BUS TICKETS:**

There is a Daily Ticket or also a weekly ticket that you can buy at any "Tabaccheria" or in the subway. In busses you can not buy tickets, but in some busses you can pay with credit card. Consider also the app for android "GTT to move", where tickets are slightly cheaper.

## **LONG STAYS:**

For long stays you could also consider a car rental at the airport.

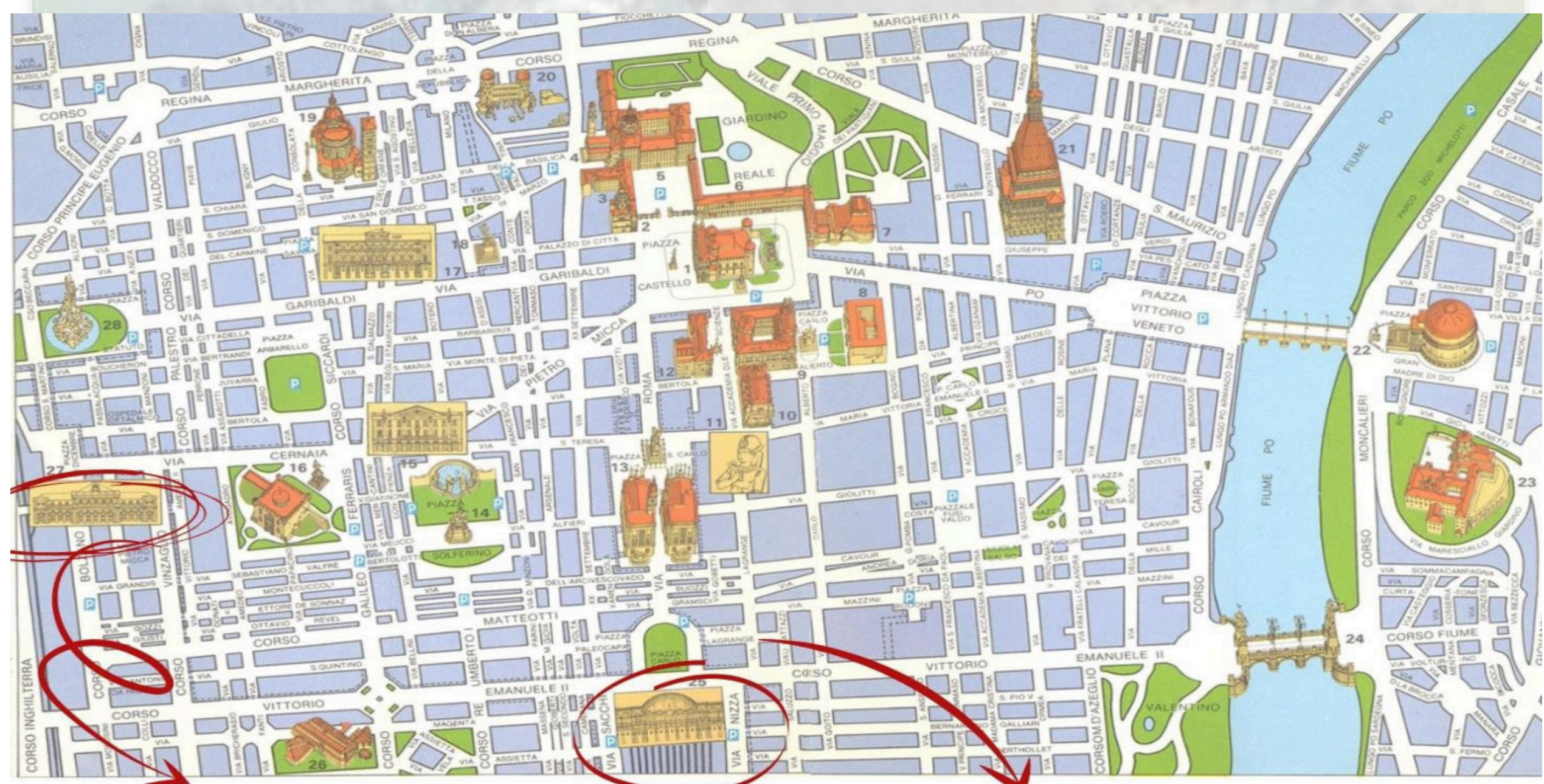

# MUST-TRY PRODUCTS IN TURIN

One of the most popular chocolates in Piedmont is *Gianduiotto*. Usually they are enveloped in paper gold or silver.

The *Bicerin* (literally little glass) is a historic hot drink and non-alcoholic typical of Turin, this drink is served in large round glasses, consisting of a mixture of coffee, chocolate and cream sweetened with syrup.

The bonet, whose name means "hat" in Piedmontese, is the typical traditional Piedmontese pudding made with eggs, sugar, cocoa, milk, liqueur and dried macarons.

Note: Turin is well known for chocolate, in fact Italian chocolate tradition was born here

## LA MOLE ANTONELLIANA

It is a major landmark building in Turin.

Originally conceived of as a synagogue, it now houses the Museo Nazionale del Cinema, and is the tallest museum in the world. You can reach the top with an amazing panoramic lift.

## EGYPTIAN MUSEUM

The Egyptian Museum of Turin is considered the most important in the world for the value of the findings after the Cairo's one.

The Egyptian Museum is in Via Accademia delle Scienze 6.

## THE AUTOMOBILE MUSEUM

Turin, in particular because of FIAT group, has a great history in the manufacture of cars, it may be interesting to visit the Automobile Museum. It is situated in Corso Unità d'Italia, 40.

## GAM (GALLERY OF MODERN ART)

Permanent collections of modern and contemporary paintings and sculptures. You can find also some installations and videos. Via Magenta, 31.

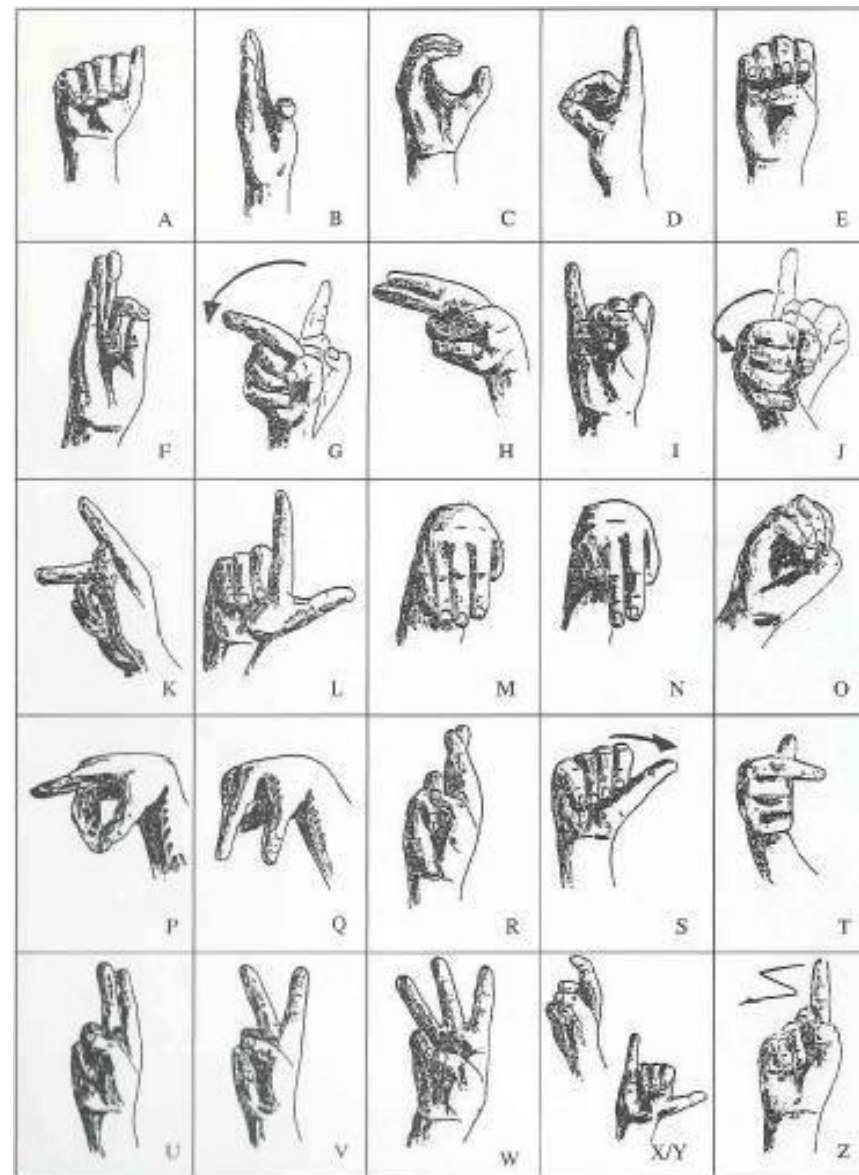
